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• The Pace of USD Interest Rate Cuts May Slow in 2025: Please Pay Attention to Risk Control

On December 18 2024, the Federal Reserve announced a 25 basis point cut to the federal funds rate target range, bringing it down to 4.25%-4.50%, in line with market expectations. This marks a total of 100 basis points of interest rate cuts by the Federal Reserve in 2024.

At a press conference following the decision, Federal Reserve Chair Jerome Powell stated that the Fed will likely proceed "more cautiously" when considering adjustments to policy rates in the future. He emphasized that any interest rate cuts in 2025 would depend on future data rather than current forecasts, and the Fed will only consider further rate cuts after observing improvements in inflation.

According to current forecasts by major financial institutions, the cumulative rate cut for 2025 is expected to be 50 basis points, equivalent to two cuts, compared to the earlier projection in September of four cuts. At this point, the future scope of USD interest rate cuts remains uncertain, particularly with the inauguration of a new U.S. administration, which is likely to increase this uncertainty.

We urge all parties to stay updated on developments related to USD interest rate cuts and to focus on risk control. The Finance Department will continue to monitor market information and provide updates in real time.

Djibouti Introduces 0.2% Withholding Tax on Transfers: Key Updates for Businesses and Individuals

The Government of Djibouti has issued Presidential Decree No. N150AN249, introducing a new financial regulation under Article 10. The decree establishes a 0.2% withholding tax on telegraphic transactions, mobile payments, and transfers made through agents. The specific legal provisions are as follows:

Article 10: A tax is introduced on telegraphic transactions, mobile money, and transfer agents through transfers, with a withholding tax of 0.2% per transfer. The following transactions are exempt from this tax:

- Any transaction below 1,000 FD;
- Internal transfers within the Republic of Djibouti related to account-to-account or bank-to-bank transfers made by the same account holder.

At present, the Finance Department has communicated with the CAC Bank and EXIM Bank. EXIM Bank confirmed that it has received the notice, and CAC Bank said it will take measures later. The Finance Department reminds DIFTZ customers to pay attention to the implementation of withholding tax on transfers and mobile payments to avoid any inconvenience.

Article I title: A Legal Tool for Creditor Protection in Djiboutian Legislation

Privilege is a legal right granted by law that allows creditors to secure their claims against defaulting debtors. It serves as an essential tool for creditor protection, particularly within the framework of obligations and security law. This essay provides a detailed analysis of the legal foundations of privilege in Djibouti, its conditions of application, various forms, practical implications, and broader socio-economic impacts.

1. The Concept and Role of Privilege

In the Djiboutian legal framework, privilege is based on a creditor-debtor relationship, granting the creditor a priority right over certain debtor assets. This right, defined in the Djiboutian Civil Code (Articles 2092 et seq.), ensures that the creditor can seize or retain the debtor's assets until the debt is paid. Privilege plays a crucial role in safeguarding creditors' rights, particularly in cases where debtors attempt to evade their obligations. By prioritizing certain claims, it reinforces the principle of fairness in financial transactions and reduces risks for creditors.

Moreover, privilege contributes to the stability of commercial activities by providing assurance to service providers and lenders that their interests are protected, even in the event of debtor insolvency.

2. Legal Basis of Privilege in Djibouti

The legal framework for privilege in Djibouti is outlined in three main codes:

a. The Civil Code

The Civil Code governs privileges related to obligations and securities. Articles 2296 to 2380 cover real securities, while Articles 2268 to 2295 address personal securities. Privilege under the Civil Code ensures creditors have a legal basis to claim priority over specific assets.

b. The Code of Civil Procedure

This code details the procedural aspects of enforcing privileges. It includes rules for notifying debtors, seizing assets, and obtaining court authorization for asset liquidation.

c. The Commercial Code

The Commercial Code establishes the hierarchy of claims in cases of bankruptcy or judicial liquidation. It specifies that privileged creditors, such as employees and the public treasury, are prioritized over others, including mortgage holders.

3. Conditions for Establishing Privilege

To establish a valid privilege, the following conditions must be met:

a. Existence of a Legal Claim

The creditor must demonstrate a legally recognized right over a contractual or statutory debt (Civil Code, Articles 653, 1530, 1572). This ensures that the privilege is based on a legitimate financial obligation.

b. Debtor Default

Privilege is activated when the debtor fails to fulfill their payment obligations, either due to non-performance or financial incapacity (Civil Code, Articles 1539, 1550).

c. Direct Link to Assets

Privilege applies only to assets directly connected to the claim. Examples include construction materials or stored goods directly tied to the creditor's services (Civil Code, Articles 2284-1 and 2284-2).

d. Effective Possession of Assets

In certain cases, the creditor must physically possess the concerned assets to exercise their privilege. This is particularly relevant for movable goods, as outlined in Articles 681 to 692 of the Civil Code.

4. Types of Privileges

Djiboutian legislation recognizes two main categories of privilege:

a. Legal Privilege

This type of privilege is granted by law and applies automatically. Examples include: Employee claims for unpaid wages (Civil Code, Articles 2330 to 2334).

Mechanic claims on vehicles for unpaid repair services (Civil Code, Articles 2354 to 2364).

b. Contractual Privilege

Contractual privileges result from agreements between parties. These privileges specify the terms of application and the assets concerned, providing greater flexibility for creditors and debtors in structuring their financial arrangements.

5. Practical Applications of Privilege in Djibouti

Privilege is widely used in various sectors to ensure financial security for service providers. Common applications include:

a. Automotive Services

Garages and workshops can retain vehicles until repair costs are paid, protecting their financial interests (Civil Code, Article 2096).

b. Storage Facilities

Warehouse operators have a right to retain stored goods until storage fees are settled (Civil Code, Article 2095).

c. Construction Industry

Construction companies may claim privilege over materials used in projects until full payment is made (Civil Code, Article 2094).

These examples highlight the practical utility of privilege as a means of safeguarding commercial transactions and ensuring creditors' rights are upheld.

6. Enforcement of Privilege

The enforcement process for privilege in Djibouti is governed by clear legal procedures to ensure fairness and transparency. Key steps include:

a. Retention of Assets

The creditor can retain assets related to the claim until the debt is resolved (Civil Code, Article 2281-129).

b. Notification to the Debtor

The creditor must formally notify the debtor of the debt and demand payment. This step ensures due process and provides the debtor an opportunity to settle the claim (Code of Civil Procedure, Articles L.2212-329 and L.632-1).

c. Judicial Seizure and Liquidation

If the debtor fails to pay, the creditor can seek court authorization to seize or sell the assets. The proceeds from the sale are then used to settle the debt (Code of Civil Procedure, Articles L.522-1 to L.522-9).

d. Auction Sales

In cases where assets are sold, public auctions are conducted to ensure transparency and fair valuation (Commercial Code, Articles on judicial liquidation, Article L.522-9).

7. Risks and Challenges Associated with Privilege

Despite its benefits, the use of privilege carries certain risks:

a. Abuse of Rights

Improper or excessive use of privilege can lead to legal disputes. For example, retaining assets without a valid claim may expose creditors to liability for damages (Civil Code, articles on abuse of rights).

b. Asset Preservation

Creditors are responsible for maintaining the condition of retained assets. Negligence in this regard can result in claims for compensation (Civil Code, Article 2097).

c. Conflicts over Priority

In cases of multiple creditors, disputes over the order of priority can arise, complicating the enforcement process (Commercial Code, Articles on privileged creditors).

8. Broader Socio-Economic Implications

The privilege system in Djibouti plays a crucial role in supporting economic growth by fostering trust in financial and commercial transactions. By protecting creditor rights, it encourages investment and reduces the risks associated with lending. However, its effective implementation requires:

- Enhanced legal literacy among stakeholders.
- Streamlined judicial processes to resolve disputes efficiently.
- Regular updates to legal frameworks to align with evolving economic realities.

Conclusion

Privilege is a powerful legal mechanism that allows Djiboutians to secure their rights in cases of unpaid debts. Its recognition in the Civil and Commercial Codes underscores its importance in protecting creditors and ensuring fairness in financial transactions. However, its application demands a thorough understanding of legal texts and cautious management to avoid disputes or legal penalties. When responsibly used, privilege serves as an effective means of securing resources in contractual and commercial relationships, ultimately contributing to economic stability and growth in Djibouti.

• Article II title: An Overview of the Legal System of the Republic of Djibouti

The Republic of Djibouti, located in the Horn of Africa, has a legal system shaped by its colonial history under France, incorporating elements of civil law, Islamic law (Sharia), and customary law. The 1992 Constitution establishes democracy, the rule of law, and the separation of powers as fundamental principles, ensuring judicial independence from the executive and legislative branches.

Sources and Characteristics of Law

The Constitution of the Republic of Djibouti was adopted by referendum on 9 September 1992. Additionally, the Constitution designates Islam as the "religion of the state and the people" and recognizes the mix of Sharia, Civil Code and Customary laws. It was amended by the Constitutional Law No. 215/AN/08/5th of September 4, 2007; the amendment abolished the Chamber of Accounts of the Supreme Court which was replaced by the "Court of Auditors." After some time, the constitution was reviewed by the Constitutional Act No. 92/AN/10/6th of April 2010 asserted the Djiboutian greater freedom and civic liberties that political parties and/or groups of political parties contribute to the exercise of suffrage and exercise their activities freely in compliance with the Constitution, the principles of national sovereignty and democracy. These amendments passed by the National Assembly in 2010 reduced presidential terms from six years to five and specified that candidates must be between the ages of 40 and 75.

This principle is evident in official decrees and oaths, such as those taken by the President upon assuming office and by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court, which mandate adherence to both Sharia and the Constitution.

Customary law continues to be observed within certain ethnic communities, such as the Afar and Somali peoples, particularly in matters of marriage and inheritance, provided all parties consent and such customs do not conflict with national legislation. Customary courts, traditionally presided over by tribal elders, primarily mediate civil disputes; however, their influence has declined due to formal legal reforms and the expansion of state judiciary authority.

Constitutional Framework and Government Structure

Djibouti operates under a presidential system. The President, elected by direct vote for a five-year term (reduced from six years following a 2010 constitutional amendment), serves as both Head of State and Head of Government, as well as Commander-in-Chief of the Armed Forces. The President appoints the Prime Minister, ministers, and diplomatic representatives and holds residual legislative powers in specific areas through executive decrees.

Legislative authority rests with the unicameral National Assembly, comprising 65 members responsible for enacting primary legislation. However, the President retains

Judicial System

Djibouti's judiciary is structured into three tiers: the Courts of First Instance, the Courts of Appeal, and the Supreme Court. Historically, Islamic courts, overseen by Qadi judges, adjudicated personal status matters among Muslims, including inheritance and marriage. However, the 2003 Family Code transferred these responsibilities to state courts, integrating Islamic principles within the national judiciary.

Customary courts remain operative in limited capacities, primarily in the capital. Additionally, the Constitutional Council plays a crucial role in ensuring the compliance of legislation with constitutional principles and supervising electoral integrity. Its rulings are final and binding. The Superior Council of the Judiciary oversees judicial appointments, discipline, and professional conduct, safeguarding the judiciary's independence.

Key Oversight Institutions

The Ombudsman (Médiateur de la République): Established by a 1999 statute, this independent body investigates administrative misconduct and protects citizens' rights but does not substitute judicial proceedings.

The National Communication Commission: Established by Law No. 2/AN/2nd L 92, responsible for overseeing media plurality and upholding freedom of communication as guaranteed by the Constitution.

International Law and External Influences Djibouti is a member of several international organizations, including the African Union (AU), the Arab League, and the United Nations (UN). Its legal system integrates principles from international human rights treaties, reflecting its constitutional commitment to treaty compliance. The country's foreign policy prioritizes regional stability, and its geopolitical significance is underscored by the presence of multiple foreign military bases within its territory.

Conclusion

Djibouti's legal system seeks to balance tradition and modernity, integrating civil law foundations with Sharia and customary practices. While French legal principles form its structural backbone, the interplay of Islamic jurisprudence and local customs creates a distinctive legal landscape. Ongoing judicial reforms and constitutional amendments continue to shape the country's governance framework, reflecting its evolving legal and administrative needs.

• Article III: New UBO Rules for Djibouti Free Zone Companies

What is an Ultimate Beneficial Owner (UBO)?

According to the Financial Action Task Force, the global authority on anti-money laundering and combating the financing of terrorism, a UBO is defined as “the natural person(s) who ultimately owns or controls a customer or the natural person on whose behalf a transaction is being conducted. This definition extends to individuals who exercise ultimate effective control over a legal person or arrangement.”

Typically, a UBO is someone who directly or indirectly owns more than 25% of a company's shares or voting rights. However, identifying the UBO(s) of an entity can be challenging, especially when ownership is deliberately obscured through complex holding structures spanning multiple jurisdictions with different disclosure requirements.

Definition of UBO according to the Regulation in Djibouti

According to Article 2-2-11 of Law No. 106/AN/24/9th L of Djibouti on the fight against money laundering, the financing of terrorism and the proliferation of weapons of mass destruction, the Beneficial Owner of legal entities has three circumstances:

- 1- When the client of a person mentioned is a legal entity, the beneficial owner means the natural person(s) who ultimately holds or holds a controlling interest in the legal entity.
- 2- If no natural person meeting the criteria defined in paragraph 1 of this Article could be identified with certainty, the beneficial owner means the natural person(s) exercising control of the legal entity or legal arrangement by other means.
- 3- If the persons are unable to identify the beneficial owner(s) according to the criteria mentioned in paragraphs 1 and 2 of this Article, the relevant natural person who occupies the position of principal manager must be considered the beneficial owner of the legal entity.

According to the Regulation, the companies that register or renew licenses in the Djibouti International Free Trade Zone must declare the Beneficial Owner, including detailed information about the person in control, such as the passport, occupation, the origin of funds, and share portions. It needs to be reminded that the UBO process requires full certification for the direct ownership and ultimate level ownership of free zone companies.

Administrative Perspective



This article highlights our proactive measures, recent findings, and the steps we have taken to improve workplace safety across DIFTZ.

2. Hazardous Goods Management

Proper storage and handling of hazardous materials are crucial to preventing accidents. Through regular inspections, we ensure compliance with safety regulations by enforcing the following measures:

- Storing hazardous materials in designated areas with clear labeling and signage.

- Classification & Labeling – Identifying hazardous materials based on international standards (e.g., UN classification, GHS labels).

- Ensuring proper ventilation in storage spaces to prevent the accumulation of harmful fumes.

- Using suitable containment methods to prevent leaks and spills.

- Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) – Providing gloves, masks, respirators, or other necessary gear.

- Conducting regular employee training on hazardous material handling and disposal.

- Training & Documentation – Educating employees on safety procedures and keeping records of hazardous goods.

Additionally, these drills provided valuable fire safety training for businesses, contributing to a stronger overall safety culture.

Moving forward, we remain committed to reinforcing these efforts to safeguard both personnel and property in all situations.

We consistently organize fire safety training sessions and awareness campaigns to strengthen the knowledge and preparedness of partners, businesses, and employees within the Free Trade Zone. These initiatives aim to instill a proactive approach to fire prevention, ensuring that all stakeholders understand potential fire hazards, emergency response protocols, and the proper use of firefighting equipment.

Through interactive training modules, hands-on demonstrations, and real-life scenario simulations, participants gain valuable skills that can help mitigate risks and respond effectively in the event of a fire. Our sessions cover essential topics such as fire prevention strategies, evacuation procedures, fire extinguisher operation, and first-response techniques, empowering individuals to act decisively during emergencies.

We strongly encourage all clients and partners to actively participate in these training programs, as fostering a collective commitment to fire safety not only enhances individual preparedness but also strengthens the overall safety culture within the Free Trade Zone. By working together and continuously improving our fire safety awareness, we can create a more secure environment for everyone.

- **Assigning emergency response roles to trained personnel.**
- **Maintaining an accessible list of emergency contacts and response teams.**
- **Implementing an effective communication system to alert employees in case of an emergency.**

4. Safety Precautions

Certain workplace operations require heightened safety measures due to their inherent risks. Our team enforces strict safety precautions for high-altitude work and freight truck operations within the DIFTZ.

High-Altitude Operations: Workers performing tasks at height must use appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE), including harnesses, helmets, and safety lanyards. We conduct daily checks to ensure scaffolding and ladders meet safety standards, and all employees undergo training on fall prevention techniques.

Recent incident: During the site inspection at Sadima Warehouse (CO3), we identified multiple workers performing elevated tasks without the required personal protective equipment (PPE), including safety vests, helmets, and harnesses. This violation posed a significant risk of injury or fatality.



Actions Taken:

1. All activities involving elevated work were immediately halted to prevent further safety risks.
2. The workers found violating safety protocols were removed from the Freezone.
3. Company Notification & Fine: The company responsible for these workers was informed that work cannot resume until they comply with safety regulations and pay the required safety violation fine.
4. Enforcement of Safety Measures: Operations will remain suspended until all employees are properly equipped with PPE and management ensures full compliance with safety standards.

Worker safety is our top priority, and non-compliance with safety regulations will not be tolerated. Further inspections will be conducted to ensure that all safety measures are properly implemented before work resumes. The client has been informed of these actions.

Recommendations:

- Immediate corrective action by the company to ensure all workers have and use proper PPE.
- Regular safety training and stricter enforcement of site safety regulations.
- Continuous monitoring to prevent future violations.

The company has now paid the required fine and committed to enforcing proper PPE use for all workers. so with the fine settled and a commitment from the company to comply with safety regulations, work may now resume under strict supervision. Moving forward, regular safety checks will be conducted to ensure full compliance and prevent future violations.

Freight Truck Operations within DIFTZ: Given the complexity of freight transportation, we emphasize adherence to speed limits, proper cargo securing, and mandatory pre-trip vehicle inspections. Drivers must be trained on load balancing, emergency braking, and maneuvering heavy vehicles safely in high-traffic zones.

Recent incident: 13/01/2025

An Ethiopian truck, license plate A06028, operating for the company TRANS Machallah.

The truck collided with a streetlight pole, causing significant damage to the pole.

The accident occurred due to the driver taking a turn at excessive speed, which caused the truck to lose stability and control. Preliminary investigations indicate that the driver’s failure to adhere to appropriate speed limits for the turn resulted in the incident. The truck also blocked access to the road leading to the external parking lot for several days.

CORRECTIVE ACTION:

Enforce strict adherence to speed limits for all drivers operating within the premises, especially in areas with sharp turns and high traffic.

Launch a comprehensive awareness program for drivers and transport companies, emphasizing the risks of speeding and the importance of compliance with speed limits and safety protocols.

Require drivers to attend safety training focused on adhering to speed limits, proper vehicle handling, and maintaining awareness in high-risk areas.

Install clear and visible speed limit signs and warning indicators at strategic locations, particularly near turns and critical infrastructure, to remind drivers of the restrictions.

Develop and train staff on emergency response procedures for fuel leaks, road obstructions, and other safety incidents to ensure swift and effective mitigation.

I. Firefighting Team Development

The firefighting team in the Free Trade Zone consists of 1 Chinese captain, 1 local deputy captain, 6 team members, and 10 Chinese volunteer firefighters. To ensure a rapid response to fires and other emergencies, we have conducted systematic training in firefighting professional skills and equipped the team with firefighting vehicles and personal protective equipment. After more than three months of intensive training, the team's professional skills and emergency response capabilities have significantly improved, providing a solid guarantee for fire safety in the Free Trade Zone.



II. Firefighting Skills Training

According to the firefighting team training plan, we regularly organize joint training sessions for both Chinese and local team members, focusing on skills such as connecting fire hoses, using firefighting equipment, coordinating firefighting and rescue operations, and operating firefighting vehicles. By combining theoretical learning with practical operations, we have comprehensively enhanced the team members' skills in firefighting, rescue, and first aid. These training sessions not only improve individual capabilities but also effectively enhance team collaboration and emergency response abilities, laying a solid foundation for dealing with emergencies. Additionally, a regular evaluation and feedback mechanism ensures continuous improvement in training effectiveness, enabling team members to respond more calmly to various complex situations.

III. Fire Safety Risk Management and Emergency Response

Based on the characteristics and fire prevention properties of materials stored in various areas, we have developed detailed fire prevention files and emergency response plans. These plans outline response processes, responsibilities, and resource allocation for different types of fire incidents, ensuring a swift and effective response in emergencies. To enhance the practicality and effectiveness of these plans, we update and improve all files and emergency response plans monthly based on fire safety assessment results, ensuring they always meet the latest safety standards and actual needs.



At the same time, we have established a hazardous materials management system, implementing strict registration and tracking to ensure that the source, storage conditions, and usage records of every hazardous material can be accurately traced. This system not only reduces potential risks but also improves the management efficiency of hazardous materials. We also regularly organize training and drills to enhance employees' safety awareness and emergency response capabilities, ensuring that they can take swift and effective action in the event of a fire or other emergencies, minimizing losses and injuries.

IV. Emergency Plans and Drills



To test and enhance our emergency response capabilities, we have successfully organized multiple joint firefighting drills based on the fire emergency response plan. During these drills, team members quickly reacted in simulated fire scenarios, demonstrating excellent emergency response capabilities and teamwork. This not only effectively tested the practical abilities of the firefighting team but also raised fire safety awareness among clients within the Free Trade Zone.

Through these drills, team members became more familiar with the use of various firefighting equipment, improving their ability to respond to emergencies, while also providing valuable fire safety training opportunities for businesses within the Free Trade Zone, promoting an overall enhancement of safety culture. We will continue to strengthen this work to ensure the safety of personnel and property under any circumstances.

V. Fire Safety Equipment Maintenance and Construction



In the Free Trade Zone, we have installed advanced firefighting facilities such as fire pump rooms, fire hydrant systems, fire extinguishers, fire control rooms, fire alarm linkage systems, and infrared sensing water cannons to enhance fire monitoring and emergency response capabilities. To ensure the normal operation of firefighting facilities and equipment, we work closely with third-party maintenance units to regularly inspect and maintain various firefighting facilities and equipment within the Free Trade Zone. Additionally, we have established a comprehensive fire safety management and maintenance system, regularly organizing firefighting drills and training to improve employees' fire safety awareness and emergency response capabilities. Through these measures, we aim to create a safe and reliable fire safety environment within the Free Trade Zone, ensuring the safety of personnel and property.







Ethiopia

The Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia, is a country in the Horn of Africa. It shares borders with Eritrea to the north, Djibouti to the northeast, Somalia to the east and northeast, Kenya to the south, South Sudan to the west, and Sudan to the northwest. Ethiopia has a total area of 1,100,000 square kilometres (420,000 square miles).

Ethiopia is the second most populous country in Africa and thus potentially one of the largest markets in the continent. By virtue of its membership to the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) embracing 21 countries with a population of about 500 million, Ethiopia enjoys competitive market access to these countries.

Furthermore, a broad range of manufactured goods from Ethiopia are entitled to preferential access under the Generalized System of Preference (GSP) in the USA, China, India, Turkiye most countries of the EU and other developed countries. No quota restrictions are placed on Ethiopian exports falling under the 4,800 products currently eligible for GSP treatment. Ethiopia's proximity to the Middle East and Asian markets also offers further potential market opportunities.
